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### **SILVO-TOURISM**

## Is a sub-sector of the "rural tourism (as agrotourism) and eco-tourism

There is no official/legal widely accepted definition: use (i.e. stay, walking, running, ..., eating, ...) wood and non-wood forest products (goods and services) derived from forests, other wooded land

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






goods of biological origin other than wood, derived from forests, other wooded land and trees outside forests






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### NWFPs and MCPFE - Helsinki 1993 (Resolution H1)

H/I. Noting that the report 'The Forest Resources of the Temperate Zones' (the UN-ECE/ FAO 1990 Forest Resource Assessment) shows that the European forest resource is continuing to expand in terms of area, standing volume and increment, and that the <u>demand</u> for non-wood products and services is <u>increasing</u> in absolute and relative <u>importance</u>,



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### NWFPs and MCPFE - Helsinki 1993 (Resolution H1)

### **PART I: GENERAL GUIDELINES**

11. Because of the expanding European forest resource, the <u>use of</u> wood and <u>non-wood forest products should be</u> <u>encouraged</u> on a basis compatible with the <u>sustainable</u> <u>management</u> of forests, thereby providing and increasing the <u>potential</u> for <u>traditional</u> and <u>new</u> forest <u>products</u>, sales of which can provide, for both the owner and society, a ready <u>means of financing</u> forest management.

# CRITERION 3. Maintenance and encouragement of productive functions of forests (wood and non-wood)

## 3.1 Guidelines for Forest Management Planning

a. Forest management planning should aim to maintain the capability of forests to produce a range of wood and **non-wood forest products and services** on a sustainable basis.

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# CRITERION 3. Maintenance and encouragement of productive functions of forests (wood and non-wood)

### **3.2 Guidelines for Forest Management Practices**

c. Harvesting levels of both wood and **non-wood forest products** should not exceed a rate that can be sustained in the long term, and optimum use should be made of the harvested forest products, with due regard to nutrient offtake.



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### EU Forestry Strategy (Council Resolution of 15.12.1998)

"UE identifies as substantial elements of this common Forestry Strategy: ... h) the promotion of the use of wood and non-wood forest products from sustainably managed forests as environmentally friendly products in line with the rules of the open market"


"The five-year Action Plan (2007–2011) consists of a set of key actions which the Commission proposes to implement jointly with the Member States. ... "

> Improving Long Term Competitiveness (Key Action 3)

"Exchange and assess experiences on the valuation and marketing of non-wood forest goods and services ... Forests fulfil numerous functions which are not reflected in the prices of marketed wood and non-wood goods. There is a need to quantify the total value of forests and their functions, and to develop and apply instruments to compensate for non-marketed goods and services."








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

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### Azienda Agrituristica "Funghi e Fate": Myco-Tourism



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•Excursion 1 (in farm's Reserve): mushrooms recognition and monitoring (only on 1,5 hectares left to free evolution; picking is forbidden); carried out directly by the owner

• Excursion 2 (in farm's Reserve): sustainable mushrooms picking and recognition (in remaining 8,5 hectares of the farm); carried out directly by the owner

• Excursion 3 (in public Reserves managed by Consorzio Comunalie Parmensi): like excursion 2 plus knowledge of PGI "Fungo Porcino di Borgotaro" and use of legal picking permits; carried out mainly by external "ad hoc" trained guides





- Course 1 (on request; to beginners; carried out by the owner): fundamentals of mycology and recognition of the most known local mushrooms plus excursion 1
- Course 2 (on request; to trained pickers; carried out by professional mycologist): refreshing and deepening with excursion

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- lack of
  - market demand because of difficulties in securing steady supply to clients
  - market research and marketing information
  - public funds/incentives (as to NWFPs, mistrust in EU Rural Development Plans 2007-2013)
- flawed perception by potentially interested chains (food, pharmaceutical, ...) regarding value and potential of NWFPs



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- need of
  - strengthening of the comunication degree among forest owners, NWFPs processors and institutions
  - improving integration into local/regional strategies of territorial marketing
- attention to mandatory and different requirements of legislation for raw and processed NWFPs



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- Think long term and dare to take strategic choices in order or to integrate either to increase income/profit of the firm
- Establish tactical partnerships with different actors not only linked to forestry chain
- Collaborate with those above actors
- Preferably join an association or union helps to lead new markets and to reach efficiently to the effective information to identify innovative processing techniques and processed products (<u>adding</u> <u>value function</u>) needed by different (knowledge of the markets)



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- Diversify products in order to deseasonalise selling period and meet the most diversified consumers/customers/clients
- Qualify products through services
- Ensure and enhance quality of the products (and services linked) assuring the traceability along the manifold chains/actors processing it











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
