The "We are Alps" tour



With the "We are Alps" tour we are spreading the messages of the Alpine Convention, an international treaty for the sustainable development and protection of the Alps, signed by the 8 Alpine Countries (Austria, France, Germany, Italy, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Slovenia and Switzerland) as well as the European Union.



A short walk will take us to one of the few breeding sites of the Black Alpine pig in the frame of a project for the reintroduction of this endemic traditional species. We will then catch the "meadow-experience-bus" to the Austrian border and two more "Bergsteigerdörfer": along a downhill hike, we will learn about local products promotion, energy management and environmental education in the Weißbach Nature Park. We will then travel to our third Mountaineering Village Mallnitz, which is also a member of the Alpine Pearls network.

Why & How Green Alps

Green economy results in "improved human well-being and social equity, while significantly reducing environmental risks and ecological scarcities. In its simplest expression, a green economy can be thought of as one which is low carbon, resource efficient and socially inclusive" (UNEP, 2015). The Alps offer a positive framework with a high potential for economic initiatives based on natural resources and present, at the same time, sensitive ecosystems that need to be protected. Green economy is therefore particularly relevant for the Alps. When preparing the tour we selected projects and locations that highlight

many different aspects of green economy in the Alps. Along the journey we will get to know initiatives on energy efficiency in lighting and building, renewable energy production, sustainable use of natural resources, ecosystem services and natural capital-based economy, and overall economic development as the basis for a good quality life in the Alps – at least as much of it as is possible in a week's time!
